The introduction of Bistro Powder in packaging made from recycled plastic is a step towards more sustainable handling of packaging.

Later this year, our 3 kg bucket will be launched in packaging made form recycled plastic as well.

All businesses placing packaging on the EU market will assume the legal, financial, and operational responsibility for managing their packaging waste with the introduction of producer responsibility for packaging. This includes collection, sorting, and treatment.



# Bistro Powder CL 349 is a concentrated alkaline dishwashing powder for manual dosage, and is well suited for industrial and household dishwashers.

Bistro Powder CL 349 gives a sparkling clean dishwashing, and is effective against different types of protein and coffee and tea deposits.

In other words, all businesses placing packaging on the Danish market will be responsible for the packaging throughout its lifecycle, even after it has been emptied and sorted by the end-user.'

The purpose of introducing producer responsibility is to reduce the amount of packaging, ensure effective collection and management of packaging waste, and motivate businesses to design packaging in a better and more environmentally friendly way - for prevention, reuse, and recycling.

In common terms, this is referred to as "closing the loop."

The extended producer responsibility for packaging will come into effect on July 1, 2025.

However, as of April 2024, the affected businesses are obliged to register and report an estimate of their expected packaging quantities for 2024.
